ORDER OF PUBLICATION.

The object of this suit is to procure a decree for the sale of the real estate of which Charles A. Staley, late of Frederick County, died seized and possessed.

The bill states that Charles A. Staley died testate, seized and possessed of two valuable farms in Frederick County, Maryland, and a valuable lot with improvements thereon in Frederick City, in said Frederick County, which said real estate is particularly described in the bill of complaint; that the said Charles A. Staley did, by his last will, appoint Irving E. Staley to be the Executor of his estate, who has duly qualified and is now acting as such; that after a special bequest of \$100.00 to the Mount Olivet Cemetery and small bequests of property in kind to Charles Irving Staley and Joseph Robert Staley, the said Charles A. Staley gave all the rest and residue of his estate unto his wife, Mollie M. Staley, for the term of her natural life and no longer, and after her death the same to be sold and the net proceeds distributed as provided in said will: \$4,000.00 to the Evangelical Reformed Church of Frederick; \$500.00 to George W. and Agnes Hoffman Orphanage of Littlestown, Pennsylvania; and the residue of said estate to Frances C. Smith, Stanley Vincent Sanner, Charles Irving Staley and Joseph Robert Staley.

That the said Mollie M. Staley renounced said will and elected to take the share allowed to widows by the laws of Maryland; that the personal estate is insufficient to pay all the special bequests and the surviving widow her share of said estate, and it is necessary to sell the real estate to make distribution; that said real estate is not susceptible of partition or division among the parties of interest without material loss; that all the parties to said cause are residents of Frederick County, except the George W. and Agnes Hoffman Orphanage, of Littlestown, Pennsylvania, which is a non-resident of this State.

It is thereupon, this 29th day of September, 1943, ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the Plaintiffs, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper published in said Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 29th day of October, 1943, give notice to the said absent Defendant of the object and substance of this bill, warning it to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the 15th day of November next, to show cause, if any it has, why a decree should not be passed as prayed.
