

A. Yes, sir, they correctly describe the properties.

Q. What improvements are on the places?

A. The home place is improved with a barn, wagon shed, hog pen, chicken coops, house and garage.

Q. Of what material is the house built?

A. Well it is an old-time log house, built low and long, like they built years ago. It contains six rooms.

Q. Is the barn a bank barn?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. What size is it? A. 36 by 52.

Q. Is it improved for dairying? A. No, sir.

Q. Any orchard on the property?

A. No, sir.

Q. About how many acres are tillable?

A. About 55 or 60.

Q. Remainder in woodland?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do the two properties join? A. No, sir. They ar nearly 3 miles apart.

Q. Where is the mountain lot located?

A. On the same road, just above what they call "Fox's", it adjoins the High Knob property - Gambrill Park on the east side of the Mountain.

Q. Does it lie right along the road?

A. It lays very close to where the County road goes up to the Knob

Q. Do you have to cross any other property to get to your lot?

A. Yes, sir, we have to cross at little corner that I think belongs to Gambrill Park.

Q. Your father always used this right-of-way?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. What in your opinion will the properties bring?

A. I think around \$5,000.00, it may be less, or it may be more.

Q. In your opinion is it possible to divide the real estate among the several parties entitled without loss or injury to the property.

A. To the best of my knowledge I don't think it could be divided.

Q. Is it your request that the property be sold under Court jurisdiction, and the proceeds divided among the persons entitled.

A. Yes, sir.

To the General Interrogatory: Nothing further.
