Q. Your brother Clifford is the other joint owner with your mother of the real estate near Sabillasville?

A. That is right.

Q. Where is Clifford now?

A. He is at Springfield Hospital, Sykesville, Maryland.

Q. Is he a patient at the hospital?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. When was he committed and under what conditions?

A. I believe it was July 1, 1949, that he was committed by the certification of Dr. Bridgers and Dr. Gray.

Q. Will you describe generally Clifford's Condition?

A. His mind has never thoroughly developed. You might tell him to do something, and he might do it or might not. He might just laugh at you. I think the doctor called it "giggling." At times he could work, and other times he couldn't. He is just mentally affected. The doctor said he had the mind of about a three year old child.

Q. How old is Clifford?

A. Thirty-four.

Q. Have the doctors indicated whether or not it is reasonable to expect any improvement in his mental condition in the future?

A. They don't think there will be any improvement.

Q. Has any one ever been appointed as a committee or trustee for Clifford under Court authority?

A. No, sir.

Q. Do you know the reason why the real estate mentioned in these proceedings was titled in the joint names of your mother and Clifford?

A. Father made this place over under the understanding that after mother's death it would be his. But there was some mix-up in the deed and it didn't turn out that way.

Q. The real purpose was to provide Clifford a home?

A. That is right.

Q. Is your father living now?

A. No, sir.

Q. When did he die?

A. May 17, 1949.

Q. Did he die with or without a will?

A. With a will.

Q. I show Exhibit "No. 2" filed in these proceedings, purporting to be the will of Charles R. Fox. Will you look at the instrument, and state whether or not it is a true copy of the will of your father?

A. That will is correct.

(Exhibit "No. 2" filed in evidence.)

Q. You are named Executor of your father's will?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Have you qualified in the Orphans Court as Executor?

A. I have.

Q. Can you state whether or not there is sufficient cash and personal property in your father's estate, exclusive of his interest in the real estate in these proceedings, to pay his debts and the various bequests which he has made in his will?

A. It is my belief that there will not be enough funds to pay out except by applying his
