been paid, although more than a year and a day from the date of sale has expired.

County, Maryland, in Equity, ORDERED that notice be given by the insertion of a copy of this
order in some newspaper having a general circulation in Frederick County, Maryland, once a
week for four successive weeks, warning all persons interested in the said property to be
and appear in this Court by the 30 day of March, 1953, and redeem the property mentioned
herein and answer the Bill of Complaint, or thereafter a final decree will be rendered fore-
closing all rights of redemption in the property, and vesting fee simple title in the com-
plainant, free and clear of all encumbrances.
