

Eichelberger, who reside in Woodsboro, Frederick County, State of Maryland.

That the said parties are all adults over the age of twenty-one years and all of the parties in interest in and to the aforesaid real estate of which the said Mary S. Donsife died seised and possessed.

Fourth: That the real estate aforesaid consists of a lot and dwelling in the town of Woodsboro, Frederick County, State of Maryland, and can not be divided without loss and injury to the parties interested, and that it is to the benefit and advantage of all the parties in interest for your Honorable Court to decree a sale thereof and to divide the money arising from such sale among the said parties in interest according to their respective rights.

The Bill then prays for a sale of the real estate of which Mary S. Donsife died seised and possessed under the direction of the Court of Equity and the proceeds therefrom distributed among the parties in interest according to their respective rights.

And for such further or other relief as the nature and equity of their case may require:

And also prays for writs of subpoena against the said and James G. Davison, Emma Gertrude Donsife Davison, her husband; Maurice Donsife and Blanche Donsife, his wife; Clarence Donsife and Pearl Donsife, his wife; Charlotte Donsife Houck and Raymond Houck, her husband, and Albert Eichelberger and Josephine Eichelberger, his wife, ~~Emma Donsife~~, widow, William Luther Donsife, Jr., divorced, Evelyn M. Donsife, unmarried, Ruth D. Hall and Gilbert Hall, her husband, alleged resident defendants; and for an order of publication against the said Catherine Donsife Keeney and Thomas Keeney, her husband, who are alleged to be non residents of the State of Maryland and residents of the State of Virginia.

It is thereupon this 30th day of August, in the year Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-eight; by the Circuit Court for Frederick
