TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Bill of Complaint of Martin L. Horine, Baxter T. Horine and Florence M. Maught, individually, and Martin L. Horine, judgment creditor of Stephen E. Horine, Baxter T. FIRST: That a certain Florence M. Maught, about the 5th day of January, 1940, died, leaving her property vested in her three brothers and sisters, to-wit: Florence M. Maught and Stephen E. Horine, three being residents of Frederick County, Maryland, and one being a non-resident of the State of Maryland, to-wit: Stephen E. Horine, residing at 1234 Street, Lancaster, Pennsylvania.

SECOND: That at the death of Florence M. Maught, certain tracts of land, to-wit:

(1) An undivided one-fourth interest in a farm containing 158 acres, more or less, located in Burkittsville District, Frederick County, Maryland, improved with a six-room bungalow, metal roof, and other necessary outbuildings. Being parts of a tract called "Alexander Forest of Needwood" and "Fielered", and being the same parcel of land that was conveyed to Florence M. Maught, Martin L. Horine, Baxter T. Horine and Mattie E. Kefauver, by deed from Guy Anders, Sheriff, dated November 8, 1940, and recorded in Liber No. 426, folio 479, a certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 1 to this Bill of Complaint, and it is prayed that this and other Exhibits may be con-
