

filed with said Bill of Complaint, marked Exhibit No. 2. The deeds transferring said property to W. Scott Kefauver being as follows:

(a) Deed from Braddock Heights Improvement Company of Frederick, to W. Scott Kefauver, dated September 20, 1905, and recorded in Liber No. 271, folio 543, certified copy of which is filed with Bill of Complaint marked Exhibit No. 3. (b) Deed from Eva N. Whalen to W. Scott Kefauver dated May 8, 1922, and recorded in Liber No. 338, folio 516, certified copy of which is filed with said Bill of Complaint, marked Exhibit No. 4.

The Bill further alleges that the interests of the said Stephen E. Horine in the above described parcels of land are subject to the following judgments, namely:

Judgment in favor of Florence M. Maught, being No. 286 Trials May Term, 1932, for \$6516.00 with interest from August 9, 1932, less \$2804.25 credit; judgment in favor of Martin L. Horine, being No. 285 Trials, May Term, 1932, for \$1795.00, with interest from August 8, 1932, less a credit of \$1047.89; judgment in favor of Baxter T. Horine, being No. 284 Trials, May Term, 1932, for \$1795.00 with interest from August 9, 1932, less a credit of \$1049.89, certified copies of which are filed with said Bill of Complaint, marked Exhibits "A", "B", "C", respectively,

The Bill further alleges that the above mentioned real estate is not susceptible of division or partition among the parties entitled thereto without loss and injury and it would be to the best interest of all the parties that the same be sold and the proceeds arising therefrom be distributed to the parties entitled according to their respective interests.

And the Bill prays that a Decree may be passed for the sale of said real estate, the proceeds of which to be distributed under the direction of the Circuit Court for Frederick County, and for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

It is thereupon, this 31st day of March, 1943, ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the Plaintiffs, by causing a copy of this order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 30th day of April, 1943, give notice to the said absent
