

Stull, widower, Cora Ramsburg and Grayson Ramsburg, her husband, Lillie Ramsburg and Allan Ramsburg, her husband, to Benton Stull, conveying an undivided one-half interest in said above mentioned farm of one hundred ten acres, more or less, the grantors in said deed being heirs at law of Elijah T. (3) Deed from Lulu Gaver and Morris Gaver, her husband, Everett Stull and Grace Stull, his wife, and Emma Stull, unmarried, to Benton Stull, conveying all their undivided interest in and to said farm above mentioned of one hundred ten acres, that was conveyed to Benton Stull and Purlie A. Stull, as tenants in common, by deed dated April 23, 1908, and recorded in Liber No. 282, folio 543, they being the children of Purlie A. Stull. Said deed conveyed said undivided interest and was dated November 7, 1929, and recorded in Liber No. 372, folio 334, one of the Land Records for Frederick County,

certified copy of which is filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 3. In said last mentioned deed the interests of Guy Stull and Ray Stull in their mother's interest in said farm of one hundred ten acres was not conveyed, they being infants at the time of the last mentioned deed.

(4) Deed from John H. Putman and Phoebe A. Putman, to Benton Stull and Purlie A. Stull, his wife, the said Purlie A. Stull having predeceased her husband, said deed being dated April 21, 1929, and recorded in Liber No. 352, folio 376, one of the Land Records for Frederick County, said deed containing 106 acres, 2 roods and 2 perches of land, more or less,

certified copy of said deed being filed herewith marked Exhibit No. 4.

LESS two rights of way conveyed to the Potomac Edison Company by Benton Stull and wife, both dated March 18, 1937, and recorded in Libers Nos. 409, folio 357, and 409, folio 359, certified copies of which are filed herewith marked Exhibits Nos. 5 and 6.
