THIS DEED made this 2nd day of April in the year of Our Lord One Thousand nine Hundred and Twenty five, by John H. Putman and Phebe A. Putman, his wife, of Frederick County in the State of Maryland;

Witnesseth; that for and in consideration of the sum of Ten (\$10.) Dollars cash in hand paid, and for other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, we, the said John H. Putman and Phebe A. Putman, his wife, do hereby grant and convey in fee simple unto Benton Stull and Perlle A. Stull, his wife, of Frederick County, State of Maryland, all the right, title and claim in and to all that parts of tracts of land known as "Brookfield" "Neck of Northing" and the "Resurvey of 'Butler' Lot" situate, lying and being in Frederick County and conveyed to Daniel Harp by William Heitsheu and Elizabeth Heitsheu, his wife, by deed dated 17th day of April, 1856, and recorded in liber E. S. No. 8, folio 504, one of the land records of Frederick County as by reference thereto will more fully show, and also described in a deed from Mary A. Harp, agt. to John H. Putman; dated the 9th day of May, in the year of Our Lord one thousand eight hundred and eighty two and recorded in liber A. F. No. 4, folios 533 &c., one of the land records of Frederick County, Maryland.

Beginning for the part hereby intended to be conveyed at the end of fifty six and two tenth perches on the fourth line of the tract of land called "neck or Nothing" and running therewith North twenty nine and one half degrees west one hundred and seven and three tenth perches to a stone planted on the East side of the Main Road then with said road south forty seven and one half degrees west one hundred and twenty six perches to a stone planted thence south twelve and a half degrees East fifty three and five tenth perches to a stone thence ninety eight degrees Seventy and five tenth perches to a stone thence South ten degrees east fifty three and five tenth perches to a stone thence north sixty five and one half degrees east seventy three and five tenth perches to a stone thence north twenty
