

GUY B. STULL, a witness produced in behalf of the Petitioner, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. Felton:

Q Mr. Stull, will you tell your name, please?

A Guy B. Stull.

Q You are a son of Mr. Benton Stull? A. That's right.

Q You are the one that is on the farm of 110 acres?

A That's right.

Q Belonging to your father? A. That's right.

Q After April 1, 1941 how have you occupied that farm?

A I have occupied it as owner.

Q Who has managed the farm and overseen it since that time?

A I suppose I have.

Q Well don't you know whether you have or not? A. I have.

Q Who has furnished the fertilizer and seeds for planting crops since that time? A. I have.

Q You have furnished them all? A. That's right.

Q Have you divided or shared those crops or any of the crops since April 1, 1941, with any one? A. I have not.

Q You have gotten all the crops as your own and furnished everything? A. Yes, sir.

Q As owner. Who pays the insurance since 1941? A. I have.

Q Who has made the improvements and paid for them?

A I have.

Q And you have done that as the owner of the farm?

A That's right.

Q Prior to April 1, 1941, you occupied this same farm, didn't you? A. That's right.

Q Under what arrangement did you occupy it prior to April 1, 1941?

A Well the usual way you do is half the crops and half the expenses.

Q Under the share rent with your father prior to April 1, 1941?
