the complainants herein, residents of Annapolis, Maryland, a daughter Lula May Ceaser, divorced of Baltimore City, Maryland, and a son Wesley Ceaser, whose wife's name is unknown, but both of whom are now deceased, who left as their only heir-at-law- Helen Ceaser of Lucketts, Virginia, all the above named defendants being adults with the exception of Helen Ceaser, a minor, to whom the said real estate descended under the laws of Maryland and who now hold the said real estate as co parceners; that the said real estate can<sup>not</sup> be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested therein and that it would be to the interest and advantage of all the parties in interest that the said real estate be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and the money arising from such sale divided among the parties according to their respective rights.

The amended bill then prays that the party defendants may answer the premises and that a decree may be passed for the sale of the said property under the direction of this court and the proceeds thereof distributed among the said parties in proportion to their respective interests and that your complainant may have such further and other relief as the nature and equity of the case may require; and also prays for writs of subpoena against Julia Diggs, James Diggs, her husband, and Lula May Ceaser, alleged resident defendants, and for an Order of Publication against the said Harry Ceaser, Clara Ceaser, his wife, John Ceaser, Edythe Ceaser, his wife, Charles Ceaser, Lizzie Mae Ceaser, his wife, Oscar Ceaser and Daisy Ceaser, his wife, and Helen Ceaser, all of whom are non-residents as afore-stated.

It is thereupon this 31<sup>st</sup> day of March, Nineteen Hundred and Forty-two, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, sitting as a Court of Equity, ordered that the plaintiff give notice to the said non-resident defendants of the object and substance of the <sup>amended</sup> bill by causing a copy of the same to be published in some newspaper published in Frederick County once a week for four
