Q. You all want to sell the farm?

(Mr. Clapp)

Q. John Rensberg did start<sup>another</sup>/proceedings sometime ago?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you<sup>get him to</sup>/withdraw because you ~~were~~<sup>then</sup> willing to go together and sell the farm?

A. I don't want the Court to sell it. I worked there and later came to Frederick to live. One day John came to Mamie's and he was drinking and they had an argument about selling this farm and he told me he would never give anything to Mamie.

(Objection) Not relevant or responsive to question.
