

EXHIBIT NO. 5

I, Clinton Welling Stier, of Seattle, Washington, being sound in mind, and in good health, do make and publish this as my last will and testament.

Upon my death I desire that all of my just debts be paid out of my estate, provided sufficient property remains, not exempt for that purpose.

I give and bequeath to my son Calvert Roome Stier, the sum of Five Dollars, and to each and every other son and daughter who may survive me, the sum of Five Dollars.

I devise and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary Hampton Stier, all the rest, residue and remainder of my property, of whatever character, kind or description, whether personal, real or mixed, including all evidences of indebtedness, or accounts due me, and all real property, and whatever interest in any property, or property rights that I may then possess, I devise and bequeath to my said wife Mary Hampton Stier, absolutely, to have and dispose of in her absolute right, in any manner, or form that she may desire.

I hereby nominate and designate as the executrix of this my last will and testament my said wife Mary Hampton Stier, and direct that she be appointed to serve without bonds.

I further direct that my estate shall be administered upon by my said executrix without the intervention of any Probate Court, or the Probate Department of the Superior Court, or of any other Court, except that my Will shall be probated and proved.
