TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Bill of Complaint of The Mayor and Council of Brunswick,
a body corporate, respectfully represents unto your honors:

FIRST: That on the 9th day of April, 1951, James H. Falk,
County Treasurer, for Frederick County, Maryland, and Collector of
in and for Frederick County,
taxes for the State of Maryland, acting by the authority of said office,
sold unto your Petitioner, the Mayor and Council of Brunswick, a body
corporate, at public auction for the sum of \$21.00, a property located
in Brunswick, Frederick County, Maryland, and known as lots Nos. 11,
13 and 14 on Park Avenue, in said town, and the improvements thereon, and
assessed in the names of Ernest L. Main and Ethel V. Main, on account of
State and County taxes then due and in arrears, levied against said
property.

SECOND: That on the date aforesaid the said The Mayor and Council
of Brunswick, a body corporate, paid unto the said James H. Falk, County
Treasurer as aforesaid, the sum of \$17.42, as will more fully appear by
reference to a Certificate of Sale No. 90 executed by the said James H.
