

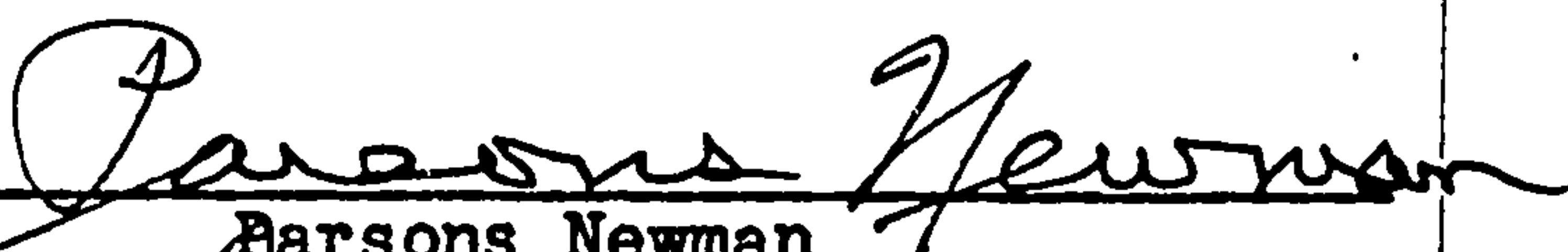
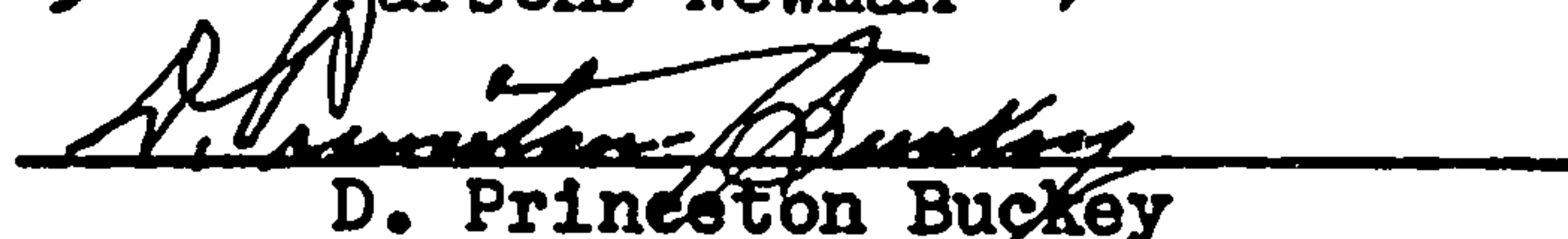

7. 8. That your Trustees have taken from the purchasers of each of the said parcels written acknowledgements of purchase, which are herewith filed and marked Exhibits Numbers 1 to 6, inclusive and prayed to be taken as a part hereof.

9. Your Trustees further report that the total amount of sales is the sum of Thirty Thousand, Two Hundred and Fifty Dollars (\$30,250.00).
