

estate sold and the proceeds arising therefrom divided according to the interests of the respective parties.

TO THE END, THEREFORE:

1- That a Decree may be passed for the sale of said real estate and the proceeds arising therefrom to be distributed, under the direction of your Honorable Court, to the parties entitled according to their respective interests.

2- And for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.

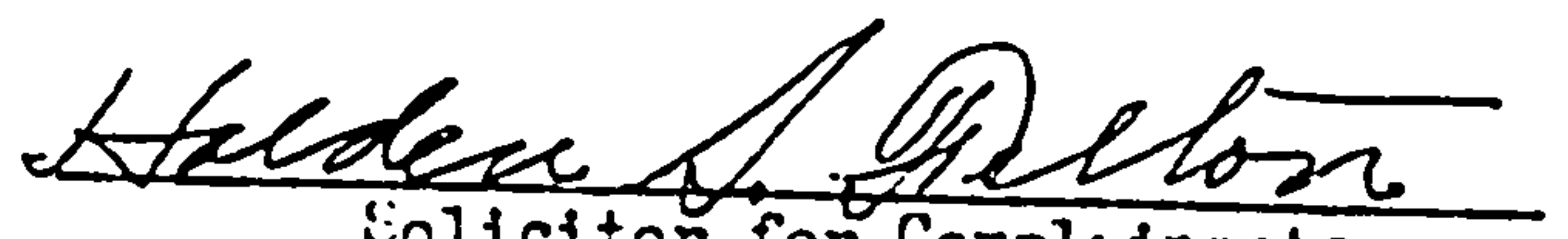
