That the Complainants and Defendants are all non-residents of the State of Maryland, and said property is not susceptible of partition or division among them without loss and damage, and it would be to the best interest and advantage of all the parties to have said real estate sold and the proceeds divided as their several interests may appear.

It is thereupon, this *9th* day of May, 1940, ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the Plaintiffs, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper published in <sup>said</sup> Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the *8th* day of *June*, 1940, give notice to the said absent Defendants, Maria B. Bristow, infant, all of Ivor, Virginia, of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor, on or before the *24th* day of *June, 1940.*, next, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
