

On the above Petition, Exhibits and Affidavit, and it further appearing to the Court from the allegations of the Bill of Complaint, and the prayer for relief contained therein, and from the testimony heretofore filed in the case, and from all the exhibits and from all the other proceedings heretofore filed in the case, that the relief prayed for in the above Petition should be granted;-

It is, thereupon, on this 24th day of April, in the year nineteen hundred and thirty-seven, Ordered by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, Maryland, sitting as a Court of Equity, that Reno S. Harp, be, and he is hereby appointed to be the Trustee, without the necessity of executing and delivering a bond for the faithful discharge of his duties as such in place and stead of John J. Smith, Trustee named in the Deed of Trust "Exhibit Deed", and who is now deceased, and who will execute and deliver unto Wheeler A. Smith as the only child of Mary C. Smith and Elmer J. Smith, who is entitled to receive a Deed of conveyance for all of the real estate in the above petition, and in all the other proceedings in the case mentioned after the death of the said Mary C. Smith, that has now occurred, a good and sufficient Deed conveying unto the said Wheeler A. Smith all of the real estate mentioned in "Exhibit Deed" and "Exhibit E. J. S.", excepting only thereout and therefrom the lot of ground containing about 48 square rods of land including Lot No. 4, as sold by Mary C. Smith, as Trustee, unto Lloyd R. Brandenburg and Elizabeth M. Brandenburg, his wife; and it is further Ordered by the Court that upon the execution and delivery of said deed by said Trustee unto said Wheeler A. Smith, the said Trustee shall be and he is hereby discharged from further execution of his said trust.
