

- Q. Those two storerooms and apartment belonged to your father?
- A. That is what the Deed took in.
- Q. I show you this statement and ask if that is the statement agreed upon between you and your sister?
- A. That was from April on.
- Q. You made a statement with your sister on that basis?
- A. No.
- Q. Didn't she pay you \$67 as shown on that statement?
- A. I believe so.
- Q. How, for the same period of time, did you charge in the account \$180.52?
- A. That is for May, June, July, August, September, and October, 1946.
- Q. Do your statements cover that period of time?
- A. No, up to that date I got on here/
- Q. But this check dated November 18, 1946, did your sister pay you \$66.89?
- A. That is right.
- Q. Why did you charge \$180.52 when you received on November 18, 1946, \$66.89?
- A. That was only part of the bill that \$66.89. I didn't collect after that.
- Q. What items are represented in that \$180.52?
- A. Electric, coal, repairs, labor.
- Q. By this statement she paid for your stoker repairs didn't she?
- A. That was just coal.
- Q. When was the new boiler put in?
- A. I believe October of 1947 or 1946. I don't know. I got a deduction on my income tax, but it wasn't much.
- Q. You say you got a deduction on the income tax for the boiler?
- A. Yes, only about \$33.00.
- Q. Did you take all the depreciation?
- A. That is right.
- Q. You took the whole depreciation on the boiler?
- A. Yes, sir.

CROSS-EXAMINATION BY MR. CIAGGETT:

- Q. Mr. Meadows, one of Ray Main's apartments is in 6,8, and 10. How many rooms?
- A. Four and bath.
- Q. At the time this furnace broke could you put in a smaller boiler and just heated the corner part?
- A. I could have.
