

claim as a lien against the building, the ground upon which it is erected, and so much other ground immediately adjacent thereto, and likewise belonging to the owners of said building, as may be necessary for the ordinary and useful purpose thereof, which claim contains an accurate description of the location of the said property and sets forth the nature, kind and amount of materials furnished and work done by the Complainant for or about the improvement or renovation of said building and the time when and the prices for which the same were agreed to be furnished and done and the amount claimed to be due on account of said improvements and renovation.

That the whole of said sum of Fifteen Hundred Fifty-Seven (\$1557.00) Dollars and all interest thereon, still remains due and owing by the said defendants.

That the said Hazel Caldwell, widow, Wilbur Johnson, unmarried, Irving Johnson, unmarried, Emanuel W. Johnson and Ruth Johnson, his wife, Fannie Griffin Thena Johnson, unmarried, Ruth Johnson and Hazel MacIver and Henry Griffin, her husband, James Johnson, unmarried, and Anna Johnson, unmarried, are all adults and non-residents.

It is thereupon this 9th day of May, 1955, ORDERED by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, that the Complainant, by causing a copy of this Order to be inserted in some newspaper, published in Frederick County, once in each of four successive weeks before the 9th day of June, 1955, give notice to the said non-resident Defendants of the object and substance of this Bill, warning them to appear in this Court in person or by Solicitor, on or before the 25th day of June, 1955, next, to show cause, if any they have, why a Decree ought not to be passed as prayed.
