A Her son and her son's wife borrowed the money to buy a beer joint on Water Street. They got that loan. I don't know how they got to sign it or anything else. I didn't know anything of it till it was all done and they had the money. But the bank accepted the mortgage of \$2500, and they got the money for that beer joint. My understanding is she sold the beer joint, she got the money and separated and she's got it all. He's holding the bag on that. I know they sold the beer joint. She claimed her father had two thousand and something, you know, besides the \$2500.
