TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The bill of complaint of Mary Brane, the complainant respectfully represents:

1. That Ellen R. Brane, late of Frederick County, Maryland, deceased, departed this life, in-testate, on or about the 25th day of December, 1928, and left surviving her as her only heirs at law, her surviving husband, Daniel E. Brane, and two daughters, namely, Mary Brane, unmarried, and Maggie A. Harris, whose husband's name is George E. Harris.

2. That at the time of her death the said Ellen R. Brane was seized and possessed of a certain lot of land, located in Middletown, Frederick County, Maryland, in what is known as "Keller's Addition", and being the same real estate described in the deed from Eliza Snurr to said Ellen R. Brane, dated August 3rd, 1882, and recorded in Liber A. F. No. 5, at folio 563, one of the land records for said Frederick County, and a certified copy of said deed is filed herewith and marked "Exhibit A", as a part of this bill of complaint.

3. That said Daniel E. Brane, while seized and possessed of his undivided interest in said real estate, departed this life intestate, on or about April 10, 1941, and left surviving him as
