

Q And what is her present condition as to her mentalit<sub>v</sub>?

A I don't see any improvement whatever.

Q How long has she been in this state?

A Since childhood.

Q Can she carry on a conversation?

A No, definitely not.

Q Can she dress herself and take care of herself?

A No, not neatly. You would have to give her the once-over.

Q Is she capable of taking care of her affairs or managing her estate? A. No.

Q What money, if any, does she now have?

A She has an account in the Frederick County Bank - trustee account with my brother, M. Landis Summers and myself, Thelma M. Glisan. She also has--

Q That money was placed there for you and your brother to pay the expenses at Springfield?

A At Springfield.

Q That was placed there by whom, do you know?

A By my uncle. There is an account of \$558 from the sale of my uncle's home at Bloomfield.

Q That was placed in your name?

A And my brother's name.

Q To pay the expenses at Springfield State Hospital?

A Yes, and we pay \$125 a year from this account to Frederick County, to the County Commissioners of Frederick County.

Q There is another account, I think?

A There is one joint account in the Western Maryland Trust - it was the old Commercial Bank - it was from my mother's estate. My aunt was appointed Guardian and she turned it over to me and it is in a joint account. It is to be used for my sister if it is needed.

Q Do you know how much that account is?

A Around \$1100 and two cents I think it is.
