MYER HAMBURGER, a witness for the Petitioner, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. Rosenstock:

Q Will you state your full name and where you reside?

A Myer Hamburger, Winchester, Virginia.

Q You are the son of--

A Abraham and Rebecca Hamburger.

Q And father and mother are the owners of this house on Fairview Avenue?

A Yes.

Q And are there any liens against it, to your knowledge?
