No. 1, folio 133, one of the Record Books for the Recording of Wills in the Office of the Register of Wills for Frederick County. Said lot being situated on the North side of East Sixth street, being the Second lot East of Chapel Alley and fronting on said Sixth street Thirty (30) feet, more or less, with a depth of One Hundred and Eighty (180) feet, more or less, to a Twelve (12) foot alley, with a right to use said Alley in common with its owners bordering on the same. Said lot being situated on the East side of North Bents street, between Third and Fourth streets, and improved with a TWO-STORY BRICK DWELLING HOUSE. It being the same real estate that was conveyed to William H. Nicodemus by George W. Heinlein and wife, by deed dated December 8th, 1900, and recorded in Liber D. H. H. No. 7, folio 432, one of the Land Records for Frederick County. This property is in a good state of repair.
