TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Charles L. Thompson, Committee, by Stewart Habbs Brown, his solicitor respectfully represents unto your Honorable Court:

FIRST: That by an Order of your Honorable Court dated the 3rd day of December, 1954, Charles L. Thompson was appointed Committee to take charge, care for and manage the property of the said Mary V. Thompson, Incompetent, under the jurisdiction of this Court, after he shall have given bond to the State of Maryland, in the penalty of \$1,000.00. Said bond having been filed and approved by the Clerk.

SECOND: That John F. Thompson, deceased husband of the said Mary V. Thompson, Incompetent, individually acquired certain lots, by deed, recorded in Liber H.W.B. No. 306, Folio 247 and designated as Lots Nos. 9 & 10 on a Plat recorded in Liber 300, Folio 540&c., one of the Land Records of Frederick County, Maryland, fronting on Washington Street, in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland 72' and extending in a Northerly direction a distance of 130'.

THIRD: That John F. Thompson and Mary V. Thompson, his wife, acquired certain real estate immediately to the rear and on the northern line of the aforesaid Lots Nos. 9 & 10, and abutting on Houghten's (Hogan's) Alley, in Frederick City, Frederick County, Maryland, from John L. Bradshaw, et ux., et al., by deed recorded in Liber 328, folio 554; and from Wm. B. James, et ux., et al., by deed recorded in Liber 328, Folio 554.

FOURTH: That the said John F. Thompson and Mary V. Thompson, his wife, by deed recorded in Liber 333, Folio 5, one of the land records of Frederick County, Maryland, conveyed a portion of Lot #9 to Winfield Keyes, et ux.; and by deed recorded in Liber 328, Folio 206, one of the land records of Frederick County, Maryland, conveyed a portion of Lot #10 to George Burck, et ux.

FIFTH: That Charles L. Thompson, Committee, intends to file a Petition in your Honorable Court to sell the aforementioned real estate, however, in view of the uncertainty of the present outlines of the aforesaid Lots Nos. 9 and 10, deems it expedient to have the same surveyed.
