

- (3) From William B. James and Carrie B. James, his wife, bearing date on the 23rd day of April, in the year 1927, and recorded in Liber No. 364, Folio 587, one of the Land Records of Frederick County;

which said three pieces or parcels of land comprise the home property of the said Lucy K.
