The Petition of Wilbur F. Sheffield, Jr. and Stewart Hobbs Brown respectfully shows unto your Honors:

FIRST: That your Petitioners were appointed Trustees in the above Equity case, by an Order of your Honorable Court dated December 22, 1955, to sell the real estate therein mentioned and after complying with all the requisites of said Decree did sell the property on February 4, 1956, at Public Sale for \$5,150.00 and made a report of said sale to your Honorable Court.
