

of \$1450. An informal release of the mortgage dated November 16, 1898, signed by Jesse R. Lambert, has been recently recorded. Is Jesse R. Lambert, the mortgagee, the person named in the mortgage, still living?

A No, sir, and nobody that I could find.

Q Was the mortgage paid in full at the time of the execution of the release to which I have just referred?

A Yes.

Q Will you look at the paper now shown you and state whether that is the note secured by the mortgage? (Handing to witness)

A That looks pretty good. I know it got paid anyhow.

Q Was that delivered to you at the time of the payment of the mortgage and execution of the release?

A Yes. (Note filed in evidence as Plaintiffs' Exhibit No. 16).

Q It appears by Exhibit 14 filed in this case that on August 18, 1923, you and your wife executed what purported to convey to Billy Hill two acres of land, more or less, in consideration of the sum of \$75? A. Yes.

Q What is the location of the two acres which this deed was intended to convey?

A Well, the land is rolling and kind of wet too - close to that springhead there in the field.

Q Close to Oldfield?

A Yes, wet field, marshy, and he wanted it, and of course part of it can be probably tenced. Of course he wanted it and I sold it to him.

Q He paid you the consideration? A. Yes.

Q That is supposed to be the full value of it at the time?

A Yes, sir.

Q Has that lot since been enclosed by the purchaser?

A Yes, sir.

Q It is now enclosed by fencing?

A Yes.
