

Q Did it adjoin any land which the purchaser previously owned?

A Well yes, the corner of it does. It runs up to the other man that comes down from where his house used to be - joins it there. The other part belongs to the other lots of the Oldfield.

Q Is Billy Hill living?

A No.

Q How long has he been dead?

A He's been dead two years now.

Q Do you know who were his heirs at law? Did he leave any children or descendants?

A Weldon Hill and Claude Hill. They were his two sons.

Q Are they living at Oldfield now? A. Yes.

Q Are they in possession of this tract?

A No house there now. It burnt down. I think the Government owned it. I don't think anybody can do anything with it now.

Q But this two-acre parcel is still enclosed by fencing?

A Yes.

Q That can be identified by anyone going there and making inquiry as to the property you conveyed to Billy Hill?

A Yes, that's right.

Q It appears by Exhibit No. 15 filed in this case that on May 31, 1923, you and your wife executed a deed in consideration of \$35 purporting to convey to Columbus Valentine three-fourths of an acre of land situated on the East side of "said Jesse E. Clary and Laura N. Clary farm". Will you describe the location of the lot of ground which that deed was intended to convey?

A Down at this end next to the woods. It joined the Jim Fisher place and Columbus' other lot up there; he wanted this to make his square. He's got a lot up above this and he wanted this piece to make his square.

Q Did the purchaser pay you the \$3500 mentioned in the deed?
