

The foregoing Bill of Complaint and affidavit thereto, together with the Consent Answer of the Defendant, having been by the Court read and considered, it is, thereupon, this 29th day of May, 1956, by the Circuit Court for Frederick County, in Equity, and by the authority thereof, ordered that *Charles McC. Mathias, Jr.* and *Amos A. Holter* be, and *They are* appointed Receivers of Monocacy Motors, Inc., a body corporate, with full power and authority to take charge of the property, real and personal, monies, books, papers and effects of or belonging to the said Monocacy Motors, Inc., and to collect the accounts and notes receivable of the said Corporation, and the said Monocacy Motors, Inc., its officers, agents and employees, are hereby directed to yield up and deliver unto the said *Charles McC. Mathias, Jr. and Amos A. Holter* Receivers the property, real and personal, books, papers and effects of the said Corporation.

And it is further ordered that before the said *Charles McC. Mathias, Jr. and Amos A. Holter* shall proceed to act as Receiver by virtue of this Order, that *They* shall file in the Office of the Clerk of this Court a good and sufficient bond executed by the said Receivers, with surety or sureties to be approved by this Court, or the Clerk hereof, in the penalty of *twenty five Thousand* Dollars (\$ *25,000⁰⁰*) if given with corporate surety, or *fifty Thousand* Dollars (\$ *50,000⁰⁰*) if given with personal sureties, conditioned upon the faithful performance of the trust reposed in *Them* by this Order, or which may be reposed in *Them* by any future Order or Decree of this Court in the premises.

And it is further ordered that the writ of injunction be issued as prayed, with liberty to the Defendant to move for its dissolution upon five (5) days' notice to the Complainant.
