TESTIMONY taken before the Court, Hon. Patrick M. Schnauffer, April 18, 1945.

Present: William M. Storm, Esq., Solicitor for Petitioner.

CHARLES F. HARTMAN, Petitioner, being first duly sworn, deposes and says:

By Mr. Storm: Q You are Charles F. Hartman? A. That's right.

Q You are a brother of Bernard Bradley Hartman?

A That's right.

Q Where is Bernard Bradley Hartman now?

A Sykesville State Hospital.

Q And he has been there for how long?

A About nine years, I guess.

(Mr. Storm: I would like to introduce in evidence two certificates of the two doctors who examined him within the ten days in compliance with the rule, sworn to before a Notary Public.

Q At the time of your father's death, John Hartman, he was the owner of what property - real estate - in Frederick City?

A Well, the present houses we have now. There were some houses other than that sold.

Q What property is in existence now that was owned by your father?

A 110 and 135 East Third Street, one at 300, 302 and 304.

Q At the time of your father's death did he have a will?

A No.

Q What family did he leave at the time of his death?

A His widow, my mother, and five boys and three girls.

Q Eight children. Your mother has recently died, is that right? A. Yes, sir.

Q Did she leave a will? A. No.

Q Then all these properties belong to the eight children by inheritance?
