Please state your full name and residence?

My name is Lewis R. Funk and I reside at 21 East D Street, Brunswick, Maryland.

What is your wife's name? A. Catherine Funk.  
You are a son of Veniah B. Funk, late of Frederick County?

Yes I am

When did your father die?

He died August 10, 1914.

Did he own any property in Brunswick at the time of his death?

Yes he did. He owned a piece of real estate located on the corner of 1st Avenue and B Street in Brunswick, Maryland.

From whom did he purchase this real estate, Mr. Funk?

From the Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore, Maryland and then after that he built a house on it.

At this time I hand you a paper writing. Can you tell me what it is?

Yes, it is a copy of the deed where my father purchased the property.

(Mr. Schnauffer: Mr. Examiner, I would like to file this deed as a part of this cause marked Exhibit "A" which is the deed from the Real Estate and Improvement Company of Baltimore City to Veniah B. Funk dated March 30, 1892 and recorded in Liber J. L. J. No. 1 folio 465 &c one of the land records of Frederick County)

What was your mother's name Mr. Funk?

Georgianna S. Funk.

Is she alive at this time?

No. She died on February 22, 1931.

At the time of your father's death who were the next of kin and heirs at law of your father?

There was my mother, who is dead at this time, then there is my sister,

Daisy D. Funk.

Where does she live?

118 1st Avenue, Brunswick, Maryland, as a matter of fact she lives in the
