John D. Keller, a witness of lawful age, produced on the part of the Complainants having been first duly sworn, deposes and says as follows:

Q. State your name, age and residence.

A. My name is John D. Keller, my age is sixty-four years and I reside at Middletown, Maryland.

Q. Do you know the parties to this suit?

A. I do.

Q. Did you know Esta L. Hildebrand in her lifetime?

A. I did.

Q. If deceased, when did she die.

A. About ten or eleven years ago, I think.

Q. Please state who survived her as heirs and next of kin.

A. She left a husband whose name is Charles R. Hildebrand who died during the month of August or September, 1928, and she left the following named children: An adult daughter Blanche Susan Hildebrand, unmarried, Ester Grace Cline, whose husband's name is Grover C. Cline, Naomi Fink Main, whose husband's name is Herman Main, and an infant son about seventeen years of age whose name is George Woodrow Hildebrand, all of whom are residents of Frederick County, Maryland, and will be all the parties entitled to participate in the estate of Esta L. Hildebrand, deceased as tenants in common in Fee Simple to the property hereinafter described.

Q. Did Esta L. Hildebrand leave any real estate?

A. Yes, a farm.

Q. Look at deed Exhibit No. 2 and state if that correctly described the farm of which Mrs. Hildebrand died seized and possessed?

A. It does.
