TO THE HONORABLE THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The answer of Clyde W. Smith, by Holden S. Felton his attorney ,
respectfully shows unto your Honors;

1- That this respondent admits the allegations of the first
paragraph of said Bill of Complaint as to the allegation of the deed,
subject to Mortgages executed by the said Emanuel R. Nagle and Mary E.
Nagle his wife, unto Clyde W. Smith.

2- Answering the second paragraph of said Bill of Complaint, admits

That further answering said Bill of Complaint this Respondent says
that he has no knowledge of the heirs at law and next of kin and cannot
admit nor deny the same, but leaves the Complainants to their proof
thereof.

And further answering said paragraph says that the interest
