Feip who married John Feip; and they all reside at 3821 Kimble Road, Baltimore, Maryland; a daughter, Gladyce Brady who married Robert Brady and reside at 948 Evergreen Street, Emmons, Pennsylvania. Emanuel R. Bagle was also survived by a half-brother, John S. Nagle, who resides at 4717 Springfield Avenue, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania.

- Q.11 Does that include all of the next of kin and heirs at law of the deceased, Emanuel R. Nagle?
A. Yes.
- Q.12 Are they all adults?
A. Yes.
- Q.13 Mr. Nagle, the property near New Market, Maryland, mentioned in these proceedings, is encumbered at present by a mortgage to Clyde W. Smith, isn't that right?
A. Yes.
- Q.14 Will you state whether or not this property is susceptible of partition, that is, dividing it among all of the parties in interest, without material loss or injury to the parties entitled thereto: in other words, can it be divided without selling it?
A. No.
- Q.15 Do you consider it necessary and proper and to the best interest of all parties concerned that the real estate be sold and the proceeds be divided among the parties entitled thereto?
A. Yes.

MR. OFFUTT: The complainants offer into evidence the exhibit filed with the Bill of Complaint, which is marked Exhibit "A".
