Q (Mr. Tebbs) Will you identify this paper that I show you?

A Yes, sir.

Q What is that? Is that the deed to the property in question?

A Yes.

MR. TEBBS: I now offer this in evidence.

Q How many brothers and sisters are there alive today, and please name them.

A There are three brothers: Ralph Valentine - that is
