PETITION FOR DECREE PRO CONFESSO

TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Claggett E. Ramsburg and Hilda L. Ramsburg, his wife, by Robert E. Clapp, Jr., their solicitor, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

FIRST: That on or about the 11th day of October, 1960, your Petitioners filed their Bill of Complaint herein and on the same day an order was entered herein directing that your Petitioners, by causing a copy of such order to be inserted in some newspaper published in Frederick County, Maryland, once a week, in each of four successive weeks, the last of such publications to be made not less than thirty days before the 15th day of December, 1960, give notice to the unknown heirs, devisees, personal representatives, descendants or successors of Henry N. Waters, deceased, and of Minnie J. Waters, widow, and of Charles Waters and of Isabella Waters, his wife, whether they be residents or non-residents of this State, of the substance and object of said Bill of Complaint and warning them to appear in this Court in person or by solicitor, on or before the 15th day of December, 1960, next, to show cause, if any they have, why a decree ought not be passed as prayed.
