

and neglects in the performance of its duties as said Trustee.

EIGHTH. That a part of the rest and residue of the estate of said Testator named in said ELEVENTH paragraph of said last Will and Testament consists of several farms in Frederick County, in the State of Maryland, now occupied by tenants, and there is no one now having authority to act in the supervision of said farm lands in place of said The Central Trust Company of Maryland, for the benefit of your Petitioner and others who are interested in said trust estates.

NINTH. That your Petitioner has no knowledge as to all the items or investments made by said The Central Trust Company, constituting the sum of \$17,677.90 named in the said First Account of The Central Trust Company of Maryland, in trust for Ella Josephine Lawrence, Margaret Jane Downey and C. A. Lawrence Downey, and your Petitioner has no knowledge as to the character or amount of all the securities or investments, if any, now constituting said amount of the trust estate heretofore in the hands of The Central Trust Company of Maryland as Trustee, for the benefit of your Petitioner and others named in said trust estates.

TENTH. That your Petitioner desires to be appointed by your Honorable Court to be the Trustee in place and stead of said The Central Trust Company of Maryland, with the powers and duties named in said "Exhibit E. A. L.", for the benefit of your Petitioner and others entitled to the corpus of said trust estates.

ELEVENTH. That the said Ella Josephine Lawrence, sister of said Testator, Ernest A. Lawrence, died in Frederick County, Maryland, on or about the date December 13th, in the year 1931.

TWELFTH. That said Trustee, The Central Trust Company of Maryland, has its principal office located at Frederick City, in Frederick County, Maryland, and said George W. Page, Bank Commissioner for the State of Maryland, Receiver for The Central Trust Company of Maryland, is resident of Baltimore City, Maryland.
