

that George W. Page, Bank Commissioner of the State of Maryland, Receiver for The Central Trust Company of the State of Maryland, will render an accounting unto said Trustees of all the corpus of said trust estates and trust property now in his hands as Receiver of The Central Trust Company of Maryland, in the matter of the trust estates created by the last Will and Testament of the said Ernest A. Lawrence, and that he will turn over and deliver, *assign and transfer by the usual methods of transfers,* unto said Trustees all of said trust estates and trust property *excepting cash and also less any amounts that may be due said Trust Company or the receiver as of record,* in his hands, and heretofore as in the hands of The Central Trust Company of Maryland, Trustee under said last Will and Testament of Ernest A. Lawrence, including all judgments, mortgages, bonds, capital stock and any other investments in said estate, including all the collected income from the said trust estates now in his hands as well as all proceeds arising from the collection of the *Excepting cash and also less any amounts that may be due said Trust Company or the receiver as of record,* corpus of said trust estates, without prejudice to any right of the said Substituted Trustees, or the beneficiaries or any parties in interest, to demand and receive cash money in lieu of the judgments, mortgages, bonds and capital stock and any other investments in said estate in which said trusts are invested;—and it is further Ordered by the Court that said Trustees will pay unto Jacob Rohrback, Solicitor, the sum of *one hundred* Dollars as a fee for professional services rendered in the case.
