

Cannon Avenue, Hagerstown, Washington County, Maryland; and Harvey Lewis, a nephew, son of a deceased sister, Annie H. Lewis, who departed this life intestate on November 21, 1935, and whose wife's name is Elva Lewis, and who resides at Gaithersburg, Montgomery County, Maryland.

3. That all of the said heirs-at-law of the said Herman Homer Hays are adults over the age of twenty-one years except Annabelle Weagley.

4. That the said parcel of real estate is improved with a dwelling house and other out-buildings, and that it cannot be divided without loss or injury to the parties interested therein, and that it would be to the interest and advantage of all parties in interest that the said property be sold under a decree of your Honorable Court and the money arising therefrom divided among the parties according to their respective interests.

5. That the said Herman Homer Hays left sufficient personal estate to pay his debts and the costs of administration, and that the said Cyrus A. Hays duly qualified as his administrator in the Orphans Court of Frederick County, Maryland, on February 17, 1947.

To the end, therefore:

1. That your Honorable Court will pass a decree for the sale of the real estate hereinabove mentioned by a trustee or trustees appointed by said decree, and that said proceeds of sale may be divided among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective right and interest under the direction of your Honorable Court.

2. And for such other and further relief as the nature of the case may require.
