TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Petition of Thomas Hardey Rogers and Edith S. Rogers, his wife, two of the above named plaintiffs in this cause, by D. Princeton Buckey, their Solicitor, respectfully shows unto Your Honors:

1. That they authorized Edward J. Smith, Esquire, to represent them in the estate of the mother, Nora G. Rogers, now deceased, but since the filing of the Petition in this cause for a construction of the Will of Charles Arunah Rogers, deceased, several questions have arisen that are not contained in said petition, that these petitioners desire presented to the Court for adjudication, of which these petitioners have apprized Mr. Smith, and by letter attached hereto, Mr. Smith has consented for petitioners to have D. Princeton Buckey prepare this Petition and represent them in this proceeding.

2. That in the first paragraph of the said Will of Charles Arunah Rogers, (Exhibit Will) he says, - "I devise and bequeath to my wife Nora G. Rogers all the property I own, during her natural life and widowhood" -

3. That the said Nora G. Rogers never remarried and remained the widow of Charles Arunah Rogers, until her death, which occurred on the 17th day of August, 1947.

4. That the Will of Charles Arunah Rogers is dated December 16, 1914, but he did not die until in the year 1924, and said will was admitted to probate on February 25, 1924, as shown by the Certified Copy filed herein as "Exhibit Will."

5. That the said Nora G. Rogers, widow of Charles Arunah
