after being duly sworn, deposes and says:

Q. State your full name, age and residence?

A. My name is Cathereine E. Harp, I am 53 years of age, and I reside at 1627
St. Paul Street, Baltimore, Maryland.

Q. Are you the Plaintiff in these proceedings?

A. Yes.

Q. Are you the widow of Earl D. Harp, late of Frederick County, who died
December 17, 1942?

A. Yes.

Q. Did he leave a Will?

A. Not to my knowledge.

Q. At the time of his death was he seized and possessed of any real estate?

A. Yes.

Q. What was the nature of his real estate?

A. Mr. Harp owned a farm in ^{Walkersville} ~~St. Pleasant~~ District, Frederick County, Maryland,
consisting of about thirty-nine acres.

Q. Was that the real estate that was deeded to him individually by I. Mary Staley,
who just testified in this case?

A. Yes.

Q. What was the date of that deed?

A. December 10, 1938.

Q. Is that the deed that is recorded in Liber 414, at folio 467, one of the Land
Records of Frederick County, Maryland?

A. Yes.

Q. Did you have any children as a result of your marriage to Mr. Harp?

A. No.

Q. Did he have any children living at the time of his death born as a result of a
previous marriage?

A. Yes.

Q. What are their names?

A. Hubert H. Harp and Elmer Harp.

Q. Are both of them infants?

A. Yes.

Q. Where do they reside?

A. Near Walkersville.

Q. Are there any other heirs at law of Earl D. Harp beside you and these two infant
-children?
