

(Referring to account) He died on September 7, 1940, and his body was shipped on the 9th to Chillicothe, Ohio.

Q Did he die at Brunswick and you act as Funeral Director?

A Yes, that's right. He died at Brunswick and I acted as Funeral Director.

Q State who constitutes the plaintiffs in this case No. 14-364 Equity in this Court.

A Charles H. Feete, C. Floyd Feete and B. Lee Feet, trading as C. H. Feete and Brother.

Q State if the funeral bill for James Lawrence Withrow has been paid to the plaintiffs and if not state the amount of the same?

A There was \$20 paid by Edward H. Withrow, a son, on the full amount of \$185. That is our part. There is a bill in Ohio on that end, but that is our part of the bill - \$185. And there was \$20 paid on October 21, 1940 by his son Edward H. Withrow, leaving a balance due of \$165.

Q Do you know whether Edward H. Withrow paid the \$20 out of his own money or out of any money of his father's?

A I couldn't tell you. I don't have the remotest idea about that.

Q You state the body of James Lawrence Withrow was sent to Ohio; will you state to whom there and the circumstances of his body being sent to Ohio?

A Well, I don't think we sent the body to this Funeral Director out there at all. I think we only billed it to Ohio, to Chillicothe, Ohio, and as near as I recall one of the family or more went along with the body, and we didn't do anything more than put it on the train and have it billed through and they paid the car fare for it. So this man then after the body got there--
