TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The Bill of Complaint of Henry Hill, widower, and Charles K. Hill, unmarried, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1. That Amanda I. Brashears, late of Frederick County, Maryland, departed this life on or about the 12th day of February, 1901, seized and possessed of a certain parcel of real estate situate, lying and being in the Town of Knoxville, in Petersville Election District, Frederick County, Maryland, improved with a small frame or log house, and other outbuildings, designated as Lot No. 28 on a plat of the Town of Knoxville, prepared by George Bowlus, Surveyor, dated August 5, 1840, and recorded in the proceedings in No. 1648 Equity in the Circuit Court for Frederick County, being part of the same real estate which was conveyed unto the said decedent by Thomas E. Barger, et. al., by deed dated April 4, 1879, and recorded in Liber T. G. No. 11, Folio 343, one of the Land Records of the County aforesaid,

EXCEPTING THEREOUT AND THEREFROM all that piece or parcel of land described and conveyed in a deed from Amanda I. Brashears to Joseph A. Swope, dated November 21, 1892, and recorded in Liber J. L. J. No. 3, Folio 295, one of the Land Records of the County aforesaid.

AND ALSO EXCEPTING the following parcels of land subsequently conveyed by the heirs of the said Amanda I. Brashears by the following deeds, to-wit:
