TO THE HONORABLE, THE JUDGES OF SAID COURT:

The petition of Henry Hill, widower, and Charles K. Hill, unmarried, respectfully shows unto your Honors:

1. That on the 27th day of November, 1942, your Petitioners filed in your Honorable Court a Bill of Complaint against Wilbur Alton Hill, unmarried, Henry Hill, Jr., and Arbutus N. Hill, his wife, Theodore H. Brashears, Jr., unmarried, and Ambrose L. Brashears, unmarried, praying that a decree of your Honorable Court may be passed for the sale of the real estate of which the late Amanda I. Brashears died seized and possessed, and that the proceeds thereof may be distributed among the parties entitled thereto according to their respective interests.

2. That in connection with the proceedings in the above numbered cause subpoenas were issued directed to the several Defendants aforementioned requiring the said Defendants to file their answers or other defense with the Clerk of your Honorable Court within fifteen days from the first Monday of December, 1942, the return date of said subpoena.

3. That to date the Defendants, Henry Hill, Jr., and Arbutus N. Hill, his wife, and Wilbur Alton Hill have failed to appear as commanded by said subpoena, either in person or by solicitor, and consequently no demurrer, answer or other defense has been filed in these proceedings on behalf of said Defendants.

4. That your Petitioners desire to proceed further with their case and to take testimony in support of the allegations contained in the original Bill of Complaint filed as aforesaid.
