

William J. Kelley, a witness of lawful age, produced on behalf of the Complainant, deposes and says as follows:

Questions by Mr. Oxley.

Q. State your full name and residence.

A. William J. Kelley; Silver Spring, Maryland.

Q. What is your occupation?

A. Liquidator, presently in charge of the liquidation of the Commercial Bank of Maryland, pledged to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Q. As such Liquidator, you are in possession of the securities and notes secured by the deeds of trust and the mortgages belonging to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation, assigned to them by the Commercial Bank of Maryland?

A. Yes, sir.

Q. Do you have in your possession a note signed by Lewis H. Knock and Pauline Z. Knock, dated March 12, 1937, in the principal sum of \$15,000.00, payable six months after date, which has been assigned to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation?

A. Yes.

Q. Is this the note that I hand you?

A. Yes, sir.

(Note offered in evidence)

Q. Mr. Kelley, is this the note which Mr. Falk has identified as bearing the signatures of Lewis H. and Pauline Z. Knock in his testimony?

A. Yes.

Q. Has any part of the principal of this note been paid?

A. None to the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation.

Q. Has any been paid to the Commercial Bank of Maryland as far as you know?

A. The note does not bear any credits of principal.

Q. Has anything been paid on the interest?

A. No interest has been paid to the Federal Deposit Insurance
