Certified copies of all of the aforesaid deeds are herewith filed marked "Exhibits A, B, C and D".

2nd. That being so seized and possessed, the said Frank Hesson departed this life on or about the 9th day of October, A. D. 1909, intestate, leaving surviving him the said Metta<sup>ne</sup> Hesson, his widow, and Cassandra Hesson, infant, as his only heirs-at-law.

3rd. That your oratrix is an infant under the age of Twenty-one years.

4th. That it would be for the benefit and advantage of the said infant to sell the said real estate, and to invest the proceeds thereof in some productive fund for her benefit.

To the end therefore,-

1st. That the said real estate may be sold, and the proceeds thereof reinvested under authority of this Court.

2nd. That your orator may have such other and further relief as his case may require.

May it please your Honors to grant unto your orator the writ of subpoena directed to the said Metta<sup>ne</sup> Hesson, adult, and Cassandra Hesson, infant, both residing in Frederick County, State of Maryland, commanding them to be and appear in this Court at some certain day, to be named therein, and answer the premises and abide by and perform such decree as may be passed therein.
