

concerned, that the said property be sold and the proceeds invested under the direction of your Honorable Court.

6. That, inasmuch as it will be necessary to sell said real estate, ~~the~~ <sup>inasmuch</sup> furniture and household effects should also be sold, and ~~as well~~ as said property is unproductive, and cost and expenses have been incurred in connection with the Injunction and proceedings in this case, your Petitioners feel that it is proper and advisable that your Honors should grant them the necessary authority in the premises to sell the aforementioned property and estate.

Wherefore your Petitioners pray your Honors to pass an order authorizing them to sell the house and lot, and also the household furniture and effects, and to apply part of the proceeds to the payment of the necessary costs and expenses already incurred and to be hereafter incurred in connection with these proceedings, and incident to the sale, as well as any taxes that may be due and in arrears, and other public charges and assessments.
