

fodder and straw, if produced, is left on the premises.

5. That, if possible, however, your Petitioners would prefer securing the proper day help and additional equipment for carrying on the complete farming operations if they can secure the same, relying upon the supervision of the said Howard W. Bevard who now occupies the premises.

WHEREFORE YOUR PETITIONERS PRAY that your Honorable Court will pass an order authorizing them to secure the proper assistance and help for planting the proper acreage of corn on the said farm, either by hiring day laborers at the regular wages paid day laborers in that section, provided that at no time they spend more than \$4.00 per day, and if this is impossible that they be further authorized to secure other persons to <sup>plant and harvest the crop</sup> till the land, for a one-half share, provided, however, all the longfeed, including <sup>fodder and</sup> ~~hay~~, stays on the premises.
